Wat San Fran Kathina


We are excited to announce that Wat San Fran's 2024 Kathina was a huge success!



Solar Panel Repair

Since 2009, the solar panels at Wat San Fran have been working hard to bring down the high cost of electricity. Over the years, these solar panels have saved us approximately \$280 per month, amounting to about \$3,360 per year. So, over the last fifteen years, they have saved us over \$50,000! However, nothing in this world is meant to last, and alas, these solar panels have seen better days. They have stopped working and are in need of repair. Repairs are expected to cost approximately \$9,000. We are still shopping around for more quotes and will update you when we learn more.

As for Akaliko, we installed solar panels at the end of 2015. These panels save us \$180 per month, amounting to \$2,160 per year. So over the last nine years, they have saved us almost \$20,000. We recently had them repaired at a cost of \$3,804.

Emergency Supplies

Luang Por Thoon explained that as time progresses, we will be subject to more and more natural disasters. So far, we have seen that to be true. Recently, we have experienced more earthquakes, tornado and tsunami warnings, and massive wildfires than ever before.

The Buddha taught us to live with mindfulness and not to be heedless. We are always in danger of an earthquake living in San Francisco which sits on a fault line. In order to be prepared, the temple has purchased some emergency supplies during the holiday sales. We have purchased water purifying tablets, 5 gallon water containers, solar electrical generators, solar powered lanterns, emergency crank weather radios, and other tools. The total cost for these supplies was \$2,300.



New Resident Monk




Performance at Kathina Event
